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From the Principal...

We encourage parents to take this opportunity to send their children to school to make contact with their teachers and friends. However, we respect the wishes of parents who are still anxious about the return to school and choose to keep their children home.

New work will not be posted on the nominated day for each Grade, but students should continue to work on assignments and work set previously by the teacher. If students do not attend school on the nominated day, it would be polite to let the teacher know that the student is continuing to work from home. As stated in my last letter, schools are considered to be safe places, particularly for children. Extra cleaning will take place each day and parents and students are asked to assist by ...

- Dropping students at the gates. Parents **must not** walk to the classrooms.
- Contact with the school should be by telephone or email, thus limiting adults in the grounds and in the Office area.
- When adults come to the Office, they should knock at the front door, wait to be attended to, before entering one at a time, while others wait outside.
- When students return to school, we ask that they

arrive in the mornings and leave in the afternoons at staggered times. (A suggested timetable follows).

• Children who are unwell **should not come to school**. If children develop cold or flu like symptoms while at school, parents will be asked to take them home.

POSSIBLE PARENT QUESTIONS -

Where do my children go when they arrive at school?

- Students in K-2 should go to the K-2 Quadrangle. Class lines will be marked and labelled.
- Students in 3-6 should go to the 3-6 Quadrangle. Once again, class lines will be marked and labelled.

What time should they arrive at school?

• We ask parents to follow the timetable below if it is possible. It will help us to stagger the arrival and departure times.

(These are suggested times which will assist if parents are able to follow the timetable).

Will my child be able to buy food at the Canteen?

• No, the Canteen will not be open.

Will my child be able to use the bubblers?

• No, all students should bring a water bottle, which can be re-filled at the taps near the classrooms.

Will soap, paper towels and hand sanitiser be available in the classroom?

• Yes, and teachers will supervise hand washing prior to, and after breaks.

What should my child bring to school?

• Children, even Kindergarten children, should bring their own pencils and other writing implements to school, so that sharing of pens and pencils does not happen.

My child has borrowed an iPad/laptop. Should he/she bring it back on their 1 day return to school?

 No, teachers will be using other resources when students return. We aim to give the students a break from devices. The children will need the devices for the other 4 days at home. The devices should be returned when school re-opens.

the Carly Ryan foundation, APP FACTS INSTAGRAM

Instagram is a photo and video sharing app that has been an almost exclusively mobile platform. Once the user has either taken/selected a photo or video they can scroll through the editing filters and experiment with the best one for that particular image.

How does it work?

After the user has created an account they can follow other Instagram users and 'like' or 'comment' on their photos and videos. Instagram is owned by Facebook and accounts between the two can be linked to verify the users age and identity.

Instagram accounts are public by default, but can be set to 'private' if the user wishes. If an account is set to public then it opens it up for any other user on Instagram to view. If the account is set to 'private' then only the users that follow the account are able to view it. Setting an account to private allows the user to choose who follows them, which gives the user more control of who is able to view their content.

Instagram is being used by young people to share their lives with their friends. Some challenges around the use of Instagram are young people taking nude selfies and seeking attention and acceptance from strangers, bullying comments and the ability to access inappropriate photos and videos. It is important you know how to block and report inappropriate users on Instagram.

Privacy Settings

Account settings can be found by selecting the three dots on the right hand side of the top of your profile page, scroll down to 'Privacy and security' - 'Account privacy' then switch on the toggle 'Private Account'.

We would recommend turning off the location function for the camera on the users mobile device. By doing this, it ensures that the location of where the photo was taken isn't embedded in the image.

If location services are turned on for the camera then any one can drag and drop a photos geotag information into a Google search and locate exactly where the photo was taken. For most smart devices, this option can be toggled within their 'Settings' menu.

Age Rating in the App Store:

How do I block or report another user on Instagram?

To report a post:

Tap the three dots above the post Tap Report and follow the on-screen instructions

To report a profile:

Tap the three dots at the top of the profile Tap Report and follow the on-screen instructions

Like any social media Instagram can be a positive social activity that keeps kids connected to their friends. Just be mindful of screen time and be aware of who they are connecting with. We always encourage open conversations around privacy and personal safety.
