MEDAL CEREMONIES -

Many parents have been calling the Office to ask about Medal Ceremonies. Following is the answer ...

We will present medals at special assemblies next term but at this stage, parents will not be permitted to attend. I do not know when restrictions will be lifted, but once I am notified I will let the parent community know. If parents want to attend a medal assembly, they will have to wait until the restrictions are lifted. That may be in Term 3, Term 4 or next year—I do not know.

From the Principal...

As we near the end of term, I ask all to be mindful of the coughs and colds that are prevalent in the school at the moment. Many children are ill and need to stay home if they are coughing and have a fever. Please be patient if your child has had a number of different teachers lately, as many staff have been absent because of cold and flu symptoms. All have been COVID tested and all results have been negative. However, the testing means that sometimes the teacher is away for 3 days as they wait in isolation until the results are back. Yes, their tests are marked urgent, but some take longer than others.

Perhaps the most telling fact about the flu season is that the casual teachers are now calling in sick, after accepting a day's work. However, we still have much of which to be grateful and the students and teachers are working hard with many rewarding outcomes.



We are permitted to hold short assemblies for 15 minutes, so we have been able to present Merit Cards and White Cards to students. The children are well practiced in the "elbow handshake!"





SEMESTER 1 REPORTS -

Semester 1 Reports will be sent home on Thursday, 2 July. These reports will be a modified version of the usual report and I ask parents to be aware that a full report will be given at the end of Semester 2. Please call or email your child's teacher if you have any concerns. However, by this stage of the year, I hope parents have had communication with teachers regarding concerns. I know it has been difficult with so many restrictions on parents entering the school grounds, but we have all had to obey the Government rules and manage the communication through various technological devices. I have just completed a Principal's Conference via Zoom, which started at 8.30am and concluded at 12.00.

TRAFFIC -

Traffic at drop off and pick up times is still being monitored closely and I ask parents not to fall back into bad habits. Please remember the following:-

- Arrive at the allocated time—not 10 minutes or more before time.
- After leaving the Kiss & Drop Zone <u>do not speed in</u> Bushlands Avenue. The speed limit is 40km and a report has been made to the Police and the Council Rangers. A fine will be a certainty if drivers continue to do this.
- At Old Berowra Road, cars cannot double park and block driveways. If the student is not at the gate, the parents must move on, so do not come early.
- Rofe Park for Cawthorne Street is still a great option. Thank you to parents and caregivers who are assisting us by parking and walking to the gate.

SOCIAL MEDIA and DEVICES -

I ask parents, particularly with the holidays beginning next week, to be vigilant regarding your child's use of chat groups via the internet. Many parents say they know what their children are participating in, but sadly when it is too late, they realise that they are not aware of many online activities. The Police Liaison Officer, Senior Constable Peter Lewis will visit the school next week to talk to Year 6. Future talks to other Grades will be organised for next term. However, parents it is up to you to keep your children safe and to make sure their actions do not hurt others.
