## From the Principal...

Welcome to Term 3, 2020. It certainly is a time of challenges, change and most importantly a time when support for others and the community as a whole is vital.

We welcomed the students back to school yesterday and in true Hornsby North style, their smiles and morning greetings brought a positive vibe to the beginning of the school term.

In keeping with COVID-19 restrictions we ask parents to follow the guidelines listed below ...

- Parents must not enter the school grounds unless they need to go to the Front Office.
- ◆ Face-to-face interviews with teachers and the Principal are not permitted, except in urgent cases. Please contact the Principal.
- Students who are ill with flu-like symptoms MUST stay at home until they are well.

## SOME CHANGES -

This term the following restrictions have been lifted:-

- Language classes after school are permitted.
- The school Canteen is operating for online orders only.
- SRE and SEE classes are mostly operating.
- Band and choir rehearsals have commenced.
- Assemblies, with social distancing, may be held but with a restricted time of 15 minutes.

## **HYGIENE PRACTICES -**

Social distancing and good hygiene practices are some of the most important factors in keeping healthy and virus free. During the holidays, paper towels and bins were placed in the school toilets. I am pleased to report that the children have been extremely responsible in the use of the paper towels.

## THE PLAYGROUND -

The staff and I are trialling a different use of the school playground. The aim is to use as much of the space in a fair and equitable manner and to cater for different needs, i.e. children who want to run their hearts out and others who would rather engage in passive activities. I am sure your children will tell you about the playground changes.

## **DEPARTURE and ARRIVAL TIMES -**

We are considering some minor changes to the school departure and arrival times, but these plans will not be available until next week. Please stay tuned!

However, we are keen to start the day as close to 9.10am as possible, so if parents of Kindergarten students would like to bring their children earlier in the mornings, it would be helpful. The afternoon times remain the same until further notice.

## SCHOOL FEES and CONTRIBUTIONS -

# SAFE, RESPONSIBLE & RESPECTFUL USE OF DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY -

Our children and young people have grown up with digital technology and it is woven into their lives. During COVID-19 many young people are using digital technology more often to learn and to socialise.

Supporting children and young people to use technology in a safe, respectful and responsible manner allows for more active online learning that can increase student engagement and participation. It also supports access to a broader range of content and learning resources that can supplement students' learning experiences. Being safe online is a shared responsibility for students, teachers, parents, carers and the broader community. It is important that families can communicate with their children about how to use digital technology in safe, responsible and respectful ways.

Here are some key reminders for children and young people of how to stay safe online:

- \* Protect personal information, including name, address, school, email address, telephone number, pictures and other personal details.
- \* Never share user names or passwords and only use your own.
- \* Ask a teacher or other responsible adult for help if anyone online asks for personal information, wants to meet or offers money or gifts.
- \* Let a teacher or other responsible adult know immediately if anything online that is suspicious, harmful or inappropriate.
- \* Never hack, disable or bypass any hardware or software security, including any virus protection, spam and filter.
