STUDENT ACADEMIC REPORTS - INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES – KINDERGARTEN TO YEAR 6

From Term 2, we're introducing updated school reports.

The new format has been developed by the NSW Department of Education in response to feedback from parents and educators to make reports easier to read and understand.

Your child's report will still show their progress across all subject areas.

Teacher comments will appear in English, mathematics and the general comment section, in line with department policy.

The general comment for Kindergarten also covers all other key learning areas including, creative arts, HSIE, PDHPE, and science and technology.

A new achievement scale and descriptions are included to provide a clearer picture of your child's progress.

The updated Reporting Policy also includes recommended word limits for comments to improve clarity: 150 words for subject comments and 200 words for the primary report

Reports will continue to include information on attendance, social development and extra-curricular activities and programs.

Parent-teacher interviews remain an important way to discuss your child's progress and achievement in more detail. These will now be conducted after you receive your child's academic report to ensure we are adhering to the new Policy requirements.

USE OF TECHNOLOGY AT HOME

In today's digital age, the importance of parents monitoring their child's use of technology and social media cannot be overstated. Around K-2 this week...






Thank you to Miss Johnstone for organising the excursion and Year 3 teachers for ensuring the students enjoyed the experience. What a great last week adventure!

Until volunteers are recruited, the SEE class will participate in other meaningful activities.

Ethics classes are thought-provoking and give children a chance to practise skills like disagreeing respectfully with others. They will be encouraged to try to find answers to the questions posed by giving reasons, finding evidence and building on each other's ideas. Each week the children discuss a topic from the approved Primary Ethics curriculum suitable for their age. Children discuss topics such as:


- how should we treat living things?
- what is laziness?

Classes run for 30 minutes in the SEE timeslot each week - Thursday morning from 9.45am.

Lesson plans for ethics classes are provided by Primary Ethics, so you don't need to create your own lessons. Ethics teachers receive full training through online modules and a comprehensive 2-day training workshop.

Students currently in Year 6 or Year 10 2025 enrolled in public or non-government schools who are seeking entry into Year 7 or Year 11 in 2026 performing arts stream may apply for an audition in one or two of the three disciplines of Dance, Drama or Music.

To assist parents and carers completing the **'Moving into Year 7 in a NSW Government School'** form, please note the following:

- Newtown High School of the Performing Arts is a specialist performing arts high school providing the highest level of education to students with outstanding potential and/or achievement in Dance, Drama and Music.
- **If residing outside our catchment area,** Newtown High School of the Performing Arts has specific enrolment criteria which requires students to audition. Audition information and on-line applications may be found on our school's website.
- Student from **within our local catchment area** who have an interest and talent in one or two of the disciplines are encouraged, although not obliged, to audition for places in our performing arts stream via the online application process which is separate to an Expression of Interest provided to parents from their primary schools.
- The closing date for audition applications online is **Thursday 1 May 2025**.

To be eligible to apply, candidates must be Australian Citizens or holders of a visa granting permanent resident status in Australia on the day of their audition.
